

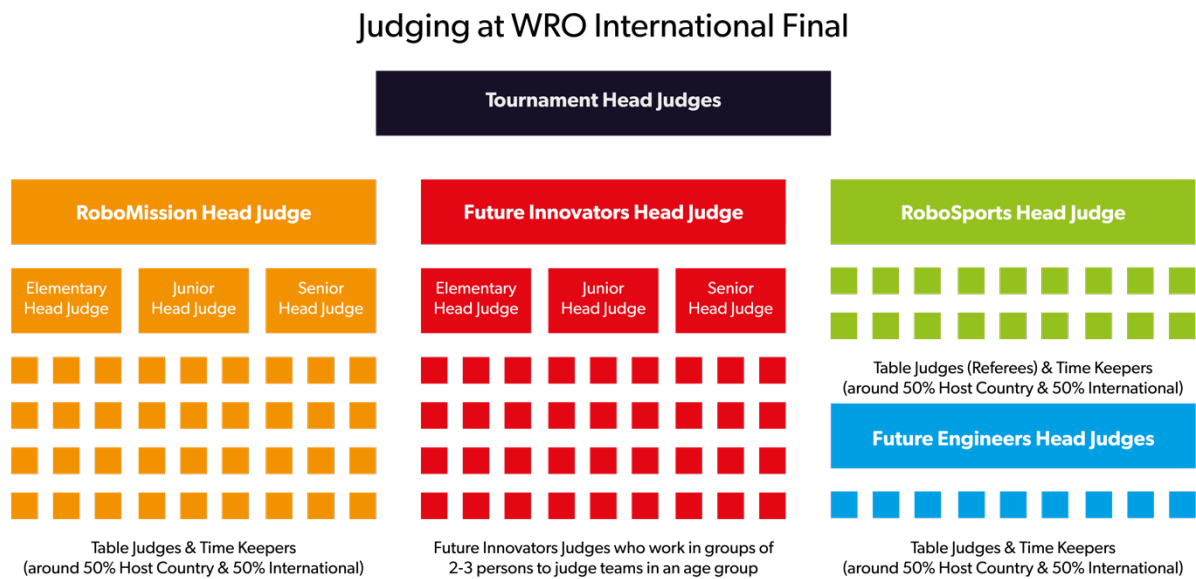


Judging at the WRO International Final

At the WRO International Final we have many judges from all over the world that help make the tournament possible.

All judges are experienced judges from our member countries and are selected with help of our National Organizers. They are volunteers and need to follow the Guiding Principles for WRO Judges. This document provides more information about the judging process.

The following graphic explains the judging process:



Please note:

- This document describes the general judging process.
- The Head Judges have the final word in judging decisions. This means that complaints about judging need to be made on the tournament day directly. Read more about who to contact when you have a complaint that is not about judging here: <https://wro-association.org/contact>
- All Judges have the responsibility to be mindful of irregularities during the whole event. Teams or coaches that break the Ethics Code can be reported to the Category Head Judges. They can decide to investigate the incident. This can have consequences for the team.
- It is the team itself – and not the coach – that communicates with the judges. The coach should only interfere when requested by a judge.
- If needed a Judge can ask a person to act as translator for the team at any time. This does not necessarily have to be the coach. It can also be another person.
- After an incident is handled, we kindly ask team members and coaches not to raise any further arguments on that specific issue with the table judge.

Judging Process RoboMission

- During the event the Table Judges check if the teams follow the general rules and if they are in time for the different stages of the competition. If there is an issue, the Age Group Judges will be called to help solve it.
- After each run at the table the Table Judges will note the score. The team will sign off on the score.
- If there is an issue that cannot be solved at the table, the Age Group Judges will be called to help solve it.
- If it is not possible to solve the Issue the Category Head Judge will take over.
- The Category Head Judge can choose to involve the coach of the team in the discussion.
- If the complaint cannot be solved the team can appeal to the Tournament Head Judges, or the coach can appeal on behalf of the team.
- The Tournament Head Judges will make a decision.
- The decision of the Tournament Head Judges is final. There is no possibility for appeal after their decision.

Judging Process RoboSports

- During the event the Table Judges check if the teams follow the general rules and if they are in time for the different stages of the competition. If there is an issue, the Category Head Judge will be called to help solve it.
- After each run at the table the Table Judges will note the score. The team will sign off on the score.
- If there is an issue that cannot be solved at the table, the Category Head Judge will be called to help solve it.
- The Category Head Judge can choose to involve the coach of the team in the discussion.
- If the complaint cannot be solved the team can appeal to the Tournament Head Judges, or the coach can appeal on behalf of the team.

Judging Process Future Innovators

- During the event the Future Innovators Judges have the ability to walk around and check if the teams follow rules. If they detect an issue, the Age Group Judges can be called to help solve it.
- After each visit to a team the Judges will discuss the scoring as a couple. The teams are not involved in this discussion and do not sign off on the score.
- If there is an issue the Age Group Judges will be called to help solve it.
- If it is not possible to solve the issue the Category Head Judge will take over.
- The Category Head Judge can choose to involve the coach of the team in the discussion.
- If the complaint cannot be solved the team can appeal to the Tournament Head Judges, or the coach can appeal on behalf of the team.
- The Tournament Head Judges will make a final decision.
- The decision of the Tournament Head Judges is final. There is no possibility for appeal after their decision.

Judging Process Future Engineers

- During the event the Table Judges check if the teams follow the general rules and if they are in time for the different stages of the competition. If there is an issue, the Category Head Judge will be called to help solve it.
- The Judges will evaluate and score the Engineer's documentation. The teams are not involved in this and do not sign off on the score. (This could be the Table judges or a dedicated judges group.)
- After each run the Table Judges will note the score. The team will sign off on the score.
- If there is an issue that cannot be solved at the table, the Category Head Judge will be called to help solve it.
- The Category Head Judge can choose to involve the coach of the team in the discussion.
- If the complaint cannot be solved the team can appeal to the Tournament Head Judges, or the coach can appeal on behalf of the team.
- The Tournament Head Judges will make a final decision.
- The decision of the Tournament Head Judges is final. There is no possibility for appeal after their decision.

Using feedback to improve the Judging Process for the next year

Some complaints cannot be solved during the competition, but they can be used to improve Judging at WRO in the future. And there also might be observations or feedback that we can use to for improvement in future years. This is why after each International Final the Tournament Head Judges will review the event and any feedback and will propose improvements to WRO Association if they feel it is necessary.
